Second Addendum to the Initial Statement of Reasons

Title 13, Division 1, Chapter 1

Article 5.0 – Requesting Information from the Department

The Department of Motor Vehicles (department) proposes to amend Section 350.06 related to the application for a governmental requester code account.

Section 350.06 identifies the application forms required when a governmental entity is requiring to the department for issuance of requester code. A governmental agency with a requester code will be authorized to access the department's records and receive those records in the manner requested by the applicant during the application process.

The department published the originally proposed text on November 10, 2023, in California Regulatory Notice Register (OAL File Number 2023-1027-01). The department also made the proposed regulatory text available on its website, in its field offices, and through email to interested parties. No comments were received on the originally proposed text.

During the 45-day comment period, the Government Requester Account Application for California Courts, Tax Collectors, and Parking/Toll Agencies, form INF 1130 A, which is incorporated in Section 350.06(b), was amended to add clarifying language in the form related to renewal and changes to existing accounts.

The department modified the originally proposed text to update the form INF 1130 A from the revision date of 9/2023 to 12/2023. The department conducted a 15-day comment period to allow interested parties an opportunity to review and provide comment related to the form amendments. The comment period began on January 11, 2024 and ended on January 26, 2024 with the department having received no comments.

The department is proposing further amendments to both subsections (a) and (b) to make clear that an applicant shall submit their application documents electronically. This amendment is necessary to make applicants aware of the document submission method they are required to use when submitting the Governmental Requester Account Application and the Government Requester Account Application for California Courts, Tax Collectors, and Parking/Toll Agencies. The amendments make clear that the applicant is required to submit applications through the department's online portal. The versions of the INF 1130 and INF 1130 A that appear on the department's website will be consistent with the hardcopy version attached to this rulemaking. The online portal will allow for a streamlined submission and approval process as the department will receive all the required information in the quickest manner possible which will allow the department to review, approve, and issue requester codes more quickly.
